DESIGN PHILOSOPHY

There is a particular moment when an Arcona comes alive and accelerates with balance and precision. The sensation is immediate, and it's a feeling shaped by experience.

Arcona is a yacht built by sailors: we notice when the reach to a control line is just a little too far, when a foothold could be better placed, or when something could be made simpler. These insights are distilled into all design decisions, resulting in yachts that feel intuitive, composed, and purpose-built.

At the heart of our philosophy is the performance cruiser: a yacht that is fast and efficient yet remains comfortable and safe for family cruising. Achieving this balance is the real challenge, and the foundation of every Arcona design.

Weight is key. A lighter yacht is faster and more responsive, while allowing capacity for cruising equipment without compromise. Combined with carefully considered cockpit layouts, every Arcona is designed to be confidently sailed shorthanded in any conditions.

All Arcona models are modern boats, with efficient sail plans - tall, powerful and easily managed - unmistakably Arcona at sea.

The hull is built to be stiff, strong and safe, forming the backbone of a yacht designed for long-term ownership and confident sailing. Swedish craftsmanship and design runs through the build, the structure and the clean, purposeful lines of every Arcona.

Our yachts are airy, functional and carefully detailed, with qualities that reveal themselves gradually, over years of use. These are boats built to age well, both technically and aesthetically.

CONFIDENT PERFORMANCE

THE ARCONA 435 MK II

The Arcona 435 Mk II is a yacht where performance and comfort meet in perfect harmony. Fast, responsive and reassuringly stable, she delivers the precise sailing feel that defines every Arcona — powerful when pressed, composed when conditions demand.

Designed by Stefan Qviberg, the 435 Mk II builds on the success of the award-winning original model, European Yacht of the Year in the Performance Cruiser category. Her efficient sail plan, low displacement and balanced hull form create impressive upwind performance, while remaining easy to manage whether sailed short-handed or with crew.

On deck, clean lines and purposeful design define the layout. The semi-integrated bowsprit, refined deck hardware options and twin helm configuration provide both control and flexibility. Larger hull windows and increased hull height enhance light and space below, while additional stowage

improves practicality for longer passages.

Below deck, modern Scandinavian craftsmanship shapes a bright and functional interior. The raised hull profile allows for increased headroom, creating a more generous onboard atmosphere without compromising the yacht's sleek exterior.

Built using advanced vacuum infusion techniques, the hull features a Divinycell foam core with fully bonded bulkheads for structural integrity. At the heart of the yacht lies Arcona's galvanised steel cradle, distributing rig, mast and keel loads to deliver the stiffness, balance and sailing precision that define the Arcona experience.

Available with carbon hull, deck and spars for further weight reduction, the Arcona 435 Mk II remains a true performance cruiser - refined, capable and uncompromising.

DESIGNED FOR DISTANCE

EXTERIOR DESIGN

Her wide, powerful stern creates generous space in the cockpit for crew, friends and family, while also increasing overall volume. The award-winning hull design – recognised as European Yacht of the Year – combines balanced proportions with impressive stiffness, delivering excellent stability under sail without sacrificing responsiveness at the helm.

Designed with both performance and comfort in mind, the cockpit transforms effortlessly between sailing and social modes. The table folds neatly into the sole when underway, creating a clean and secure working area, and can quickly be raised again at anchor or in harbour.

Twin wheels are standard, with the option to upgrade to carbon. A semi-integrated bowsprit enhances performance and simplifies downwind sail handling. The updated Mk II styling introduces larger hull windows, bringing increased natural light below while maintaining the yacht's clean, purposeful lines.

Direct access to the bathing platform aft enhances usability in harbour. Storage lockers are intelligently integrated and easily accessed, while halyards are led aft to dedicated compartments, keeping the working space organised and efficient. The cockpit coamings, aft deck and sole can be specified in Flexiteek.

Wide, secure side decks are available in either Flexiteek or Arcona's iconic non-slip surface, ensuring safe and confident movement forward in all conditions.







MADE FOR LIVING ONBOARD

INTERIOR DESIGN

The boat is designed to be sailed for extended periods of time and in all weather conditions, so a comfortable and refined interior is an important attribute of all Arcona yachts. We have therefore chosen to build with high quality materials and proven construction methods that ensure you enjoy all aspects of your yacht, whether at sea or in harbour.

The interior comes standard in selected Khaya Mahogany, varnished to a satin finish, creating a warm and relaxed living space with timeless Scandinavian character. For a lighter feeling there is the option of a Scandinavian Light Oak interior. The mouldings, door frames and companionway steps are all laminated with varnished teak soles. Attention to detail in the joinery and finish is evident throughout, reflecting the craftsmanship that defines every Arcona yacht.

Arcona yacht interiors feature consistently high-quality woodwork and practical storage solutions in clever locations. Lockers, drawers and compartments are thoughtfully integrated to maximise usable space while maintaining clean lines. Every element is designed with offshore sailing in mind, ensuring that equipment and personal belongings remain secure and accessible at sea.

The raised hull of the 435 Mk II provides increased headroom in both the forward and aft cabins, enhancing comfort below deck while preserving the yacht's sleek exterior profile. The additional internal volume creates a greater sense of openness throughout the accommodation spaces.

The generous saloon makes full use of the yacht's beam, creating a spacious and welcoming area for both entertaining and life on passage. A large dining table is surrounded by comfortable seating, while the long starboard sofa is suitable as a full-length sea berth for a 2m crew member. Large hull windows allow generous natural light into the saloon, reinforcing the bright and airy atmosphere and strengthening the connection with the sea outside.

The galley is practical and secure for use at sea, offering ample storage, generous work surfaces and well-positioned appliances for efficient cooking on passage. The navigation station is thoughtfully arranged with ample space for electronics and instrumentation, providing a dedicated and functional working area for offshore sailing.

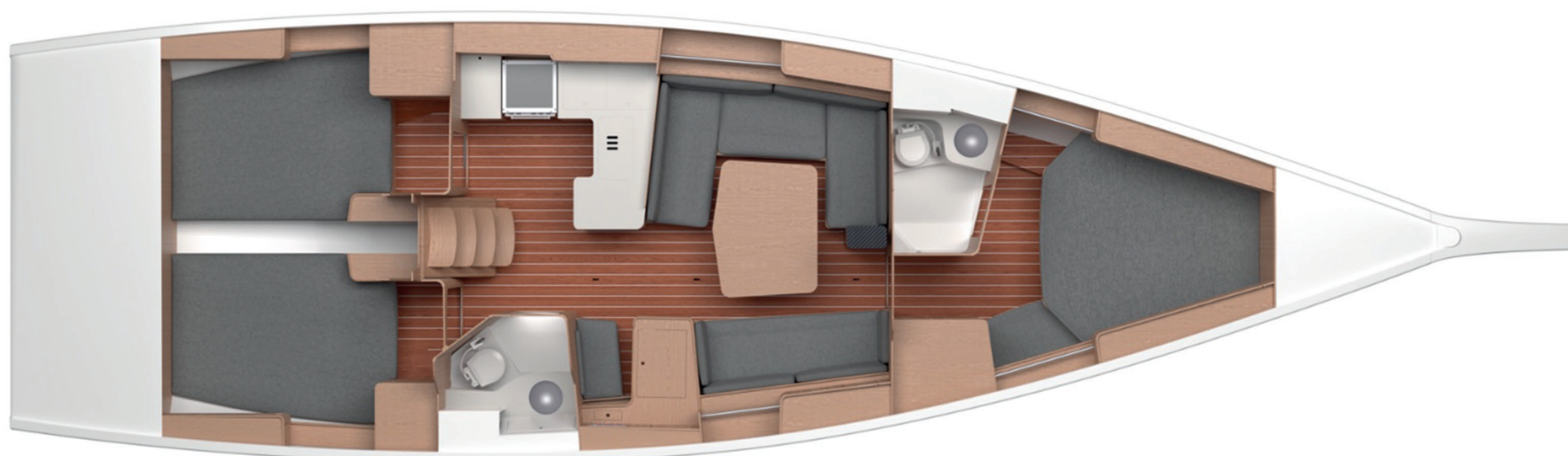

The ceiling lights in the saloon, cabins and heads consist of recessed spotlights. Additional lighting with dimmer control at the navigation station provides atmospheric saloon lighting in the evening. All cabins are equipped with ceiling lamps and two bulkhead-mounted reading lamps with integrated USB sockets.

SWEDISH CRAFTSMANSHIP BUILT FOR PERFORMANCE

THE ARCONA STORY

Arcona's roots lie in Swedish boatbuilding, beginning as a small family yard in the Stockholm archipelago in the late 1960s. From the very beginning, Arcona has been about more than building yachts, it has been about sharing a way of sailing. Owners, sailors and builders have always been closely connected, united by a belief in performance, balance and long-term quality.

That philosophy took form in 1982 with the Arcona 32, defining the Arcona approach: a racer's heart paired with a cruiser's comfort. A long-standing collaboration with designer Stefan Qviberg shaped the brand's distinctive balance and sailing feel, supported by Arcona's signature galvanised steel frame, known for its strength, stiffness and confidence under sail.

Through the 2000s, models such as the Arcona 400 established the modern Arcona look, while advanced construction methods reduced weight and increased strength. International recognition followed, including European Yacht of the Year for the Arcona 430 in 2009, an achievement shared not only by the yard, but by the growing community of Arcona owners sailing their yachts across the world.

Since 2018, Arcona has been part of Najad Group, alongside Najad, while retaining its clear focus on performance-driven design. This continued evolution has led to further accolades, including European Yacht of the Year for both the Arcona 435 and the Arcona 50, the latter marking Arcona's entry into the super-premium segment.

Today, choosing an Arcona is not simply about owning a yacht. It is about becoming part of a long-standing family of sailors, people who value craftsmanship, sailing performance and the quiet confidence that comes from a boat built by those who truly sail themselves
